13 Game Seattle Medley Format

Rules of Play

Match Format

A Match is composed of 13 games divided into 5 sets. Each game is best of 3 legs (or first to win two). The 1st set is 4 Singles games. The 2nd set is 2 Doubles games. The 3rd set is 4 more Singles games. The 4th set is 2 more Doubles games. The 5th set is the Team Game. The team game is worth 1 point and the other games are worth 3 points. A match is 37 points.

In Singles all games use the "Seattle Medley" format which is described below..

In a Doubles set both teams don't play the same games. One game is best of 3 legs 501 (double in double out) and the other game is best of 3 legs cricket.

The Team Game is a single leg of 1001 Single in, Double out with all players playing.

Corking

Cork every leg, away team has choice for corking the first leg, home team has choice of corking for 2nd leg, away team has choice for corking the third leg

Seattle Medley format

"Seattle Medley" format is best of 3 legs (or first to win 2 legs) played in the following order:

- 1st leg 501 Single in, Double out
- 2nd leg Cricket, "American Point"
- 3rd leg 301 Double in, Double out (if necessary)

Scoring

Games are scored as follows:

Player minimums:

4 players: 5 games (1 from each of the first 4 sets plus the team game)

5 players: 4 games (at least 1 singles game and a least 1 doubles game plus the team game)

6 players: 3 games (1 singles game. 1 doubles game and the team game)

After the Match is over

Typically both captains will sign the score sheet and each will keep one of the bottom two copies of the score sheet. Signatures by both captains on the score sheet signify that the match was played with no disputes. Any disputes should be submitted to board@seattledarts.com within 48 hours of the end of the match during which the dispute occurred.

The home captain is responsible for:

Holding onto both his/her copy of the score sheet and the top white copy **as well as** sending a high-quality digital copy of the top score sheet to the Competition Secretary via email at compsec@seattledarts.com, within 24 hours of the completion of the match.
